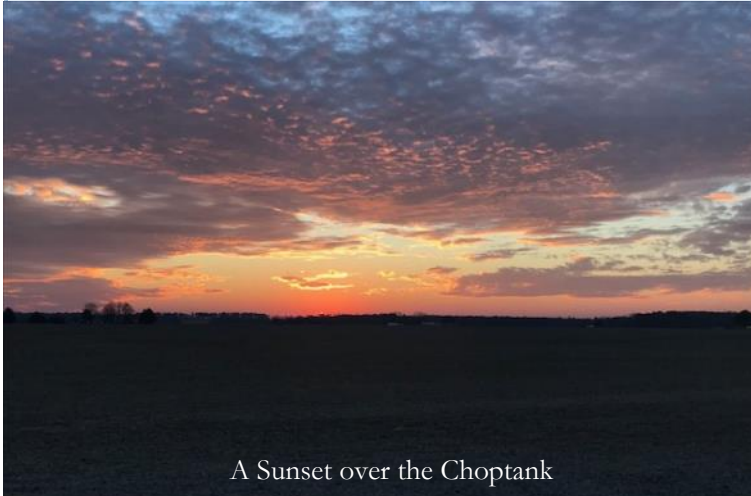

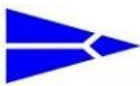

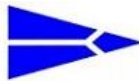

Junior Sailing is coming back to TAYC! The pandemic has taken a toll on all of us. We've spent far too many hours staring at computer screens, far too many days inside and above all - not enough time on the water with friends! We aim to change that this Summer.

We are excited to announce that the Junior Sail Program will be up and running this June. The program dates are: June 28th - August 6th. We will have all the elements of previous years, including: Learn to Sail, Beginner Racing and Advanced Racing. We have already signed on some new instructors and will be returning some old favorites as well.

Of course, there will be some changes to keep our children safe and keep up with the latest recommendations for containing COVID. For that reason, some of the details of the program are still vague at this time but we will communicate further as the time gets closer.

When I was racing sailboats, one of my favorite activities was to lay out the summer regatta schedule and think about the great places I would visit and sail. Unfortunately, until we know more about what the summer will look like we can't make any travel plans. We will monitor the situation and update you as soon as possible. Our goal is to add as many events as we safely can, keeping in mind that practice at home is also important.

Class sizes will be limited. There will be a low student to instructor ratio to ensure safety and social distancing. For this reason, classes will fill quickly then a wait list will be started. As the season gets closer and more is known about the virus and best safety practices, we will revisit class sizes and wait lists, and evaluate if and where we can expand.
